Happy New Year to all! As we step into 2025, I'm filled with optimism and gratitude for our incredible city.

The last few months have been filled with community gatherings and a renewed focus on one of the most pressing issues in city – recruiting and retaining medical professionals to provide timely healthcare for our residents.

We're thrilled the South Peace Primary Care Network (PCN) Service Plan <u>was approved</u> - a significant step forward for our community! The plan includes new initiatives and 21 net new healthcare workers for the region, including physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses and allied health professionals.

This news builds on the City's investment to purchase the Eljen medical clinic to create a healthcare hub that will be central to implementing the strategies included in the Service Plan.


We've been busy attending a number of sessions to collaborate on new healthcare initiatives and keep the community informed on the progress underway. Council Sudnik and I are regularly attending the Physician Recruitment & Retention meeting which is a great opportunity to work directly with healthcare organizations and physicians to develop new solutions.

In a recent meeting with Northern Health, I was informed that the net gain of employees in 2024 was 877 – which is a substantial increase. We have a long way to go, but it's great to see the recruitment efforts paying off.

I also attended Rotary Club meetings alongside the South Peace Division of Family Practice to discuss recruitment efforts. The team is looking for ways to ensure physicians moving here are linked to a supportive network and feel welcome before they even set foot in our community.

Healthcare was the hot topic at the Seniors Roundtable I hosted, where guests from Northern Health provided an update on the new <u>hospital</u> – only two years until the state-of-the-art facility is complete!

Thank you to all the organizations who put on holiday events this season – the spirit of giving was alive and well. Here's to a new year filled with health, happiness and success! ~ Mayor Dober

From Classroom to Construction

Introducing a fantastic new partnership!

You may notice some activity on the Dawson Creek Exhibition Grounds as students from the Northern Lights College Enhanced Carpentry Foundation build a new horse barn on the grounds.

It's a <u>collaboration</u> between the City of Dawson Creek, Northern Lights College and the Dawson Creek Exhibition Association (DCEA). The students will learn the entire process of building construction, from framing the walls to installing the roof trusses, and the project will create an important legacy for the community.

A barn is built the same way as a house, just without things like internal wiring and plumbing. This reduces the need for outside contractors to complete parts of the project that aren't part of the curriculum. By building a barn, the students still meet the required learning outcomes and the DCEA gets a new event space.

The new barn will provide available boarding for arena users and increase the capacity to host light horse shows. "When large organizations come together with a shared vision, it's these kinds of partnerships that truly move projects forward and drive meaningful change," says Mayor Dober.

"This project will enhance the capacity for hosting events at the fairgrounds, and we are excited to work alongside all parties involved to achieve this milestone, which will benefit the entire community."

Grandview Neighbourhood Concept Plan

Iln November, City Staff launched a survey and in-person engagement asking our residents how the site at 1100 95 Avenue should be utilized.

<u>The Grandview Neighbourhood Concept Plan</u> will be a long-range planning document that will guide Council in the decision-making process.

The area previously housed the Grandview School and the Kiwanis Performing Arts Centre. The second round of public engagement will take place in March and we will present the plan to Council this Spring.
